Lake Levels Down

This summer’s lake level is at a 20 year low! We have all suffered from a severe drought this year, but we are finally catching up on rain, just ask some of the wet boaters who know how hard the rain stings when you try to cruise in to the dock!!

The lake is down from full depth less than 2’, but it really makes a difference. We are up to 5 dinged prop’s, so when in doubt follow a bigger boat!!

MOST of our prop damage has occurred when the boat is simply floating too close to the shore and it bangs against a rock, or the boat starts off too close to the shore and bottoms out while going up on plane. Simply stay away from the shoreline, or if you are close to shore take it easy and watch your depth!

Our lakes primary function is to control the Cumberland River waterway. Our water is used to control the depth of the Cumberland river for inner-coastal waterway traffic. Wolf Creek dam is used for this purpose as well and as you may know that lake has

been practically drained because of inspection issues, so our water has been used more this summer.

As we approach the winter months believe it or not, the lake will go down at least another 6 feet! As the levels begin to drop, everyone needs to be extra aware of where they are on the lake. What was previously a safe place to boat may no longer be safe!! I’m sure Ed the Dock Master will make you well aware of this. Happy Boating!!
